

ADWR's Role

Created By Groundwater Management Act (1980)

- Administers the state's water laws, explores methods of augmenting water supplies to meet future demands, and works to develop public policies that promote conservation and equitable distribution of water
- Groundwater Rights and Surface Water Rights Programs
- Administers Assured and Adequate Water Supply Program
- Administers Recharge and Recovery Program
- Regional Planning
- Colorado River Management
- Represents the State of Arizona in Indian Water Rights Settlements
- Dam Safety and Flood Mitigation
- Hydrology



Sources of Water In Arizona

- Groundwater
- Colorado River Water
 - Main Stem
 - Central Arizona Project (CAP)
- Effluent
- Surface Water

Groundwater Management Act (1980)

- Created Arizona Department of Water Resources
- Goals of the GMA:
 - Control severe groundwater depletion
 - Provide the means for allocating Arizona's limited groundwater resources to most effectively meet the state's changing water needs
 - Augment Arizona's groundwater supplies through development of additional water supplies

Active Management Areas

- ► Highest degree of regulation in State
- ▶ Need withdrawal authority to pump >35 gallons per minute
- ► New "Non-Exempt" wells may require hydrologic impact analysis
 - Well spacing rules
- ▶ Must measure and report water use >35 gallons per minute
- Management Plans Mandatory conservation requirements for most users (municipal, agricultural and industrial)

Active Management Area Goals

Phoenix AMA:

To achieve safe-yield by the year 2025

Pinal AMA:

To preserve that economy for as long as feasible, while considering the need to preserve groundwater for future non-irrigation uses

Prescott AMA:

To achieve safe-yield by the year 2025

Tucson AMA:

To achieve safe-yield by the year 2025

Santa Cruz AMA:

To maintain a safe-yield condition in the active management area and to prevent local water tables from experiencing long term declines

Irrigation Non-Expansion Areas

- ► Harquahala
- ▶ Douglas
- ► Joseph City
- Groundwater depletion is not as severe as AMAs but requires further regulation
- No new irrigated lands
 - Substitution of Acres possible

Grandfathered Groundwater Rights

Based on historic pumping (1975-1979)

- IRRIGATION GRANDFATHERED RIGHTS
- TYPE I NON-IRRIGATION GRANDFATHERED RIGHTS
 - Converted from an Irrigation GFR
- TYPE 2 NON-IRRIGATION GRANDFATHERED RIGHTS
 - Based on historic pumping for a non-irrigation purpose
 - Portable within AMA of Origin

Service Area Rights

- City/town/private water company/irrigation districts: Pumping and Delivery to Non-Irrigation Customers
- Untreated water provider: Pumping and Delivery to Landscapes Via Non-Potable Distribution System
- **Expandable Rights:** Grow to Serve Service Area Population

Assured Water Supply Program

- Inside AMAs
- Established in 1980
- Rules adopted in 1995
- ► ADRE cannot issue Subdivision Plats without 100-year AWS Demonstration
 - Certificates of Assured Supply
 - Service by water provider with Designation of Assured Supply
- Public Notice Process
 - Certificates
 - Designations

Adequate Water Supply Program

- Outside the AMAs
- Established in 1973
- Consumer advisory program
 - Plats can be approved with inadequate determination. Disclosure of inadequate water supply required to first buyer
 - Water Adequacy Reports
 - Service by water provider with Designation of Adequate Supply
- Required Public Notice Process
 - Designations of Adequacy
 - Water Adequacy Reports
- Local governments can require adequacy
 - Yuma County, Cochise County, Patagonia, Clarkdale

Well Drilling Requirements

Applies to man-made openings in the earth through which water may be withdrawn or obtained from beneath the surface of the earth, including all water wells, monitor wells and piezometer wells.

- Well Registration/Permitting
 - "Notice of Intent" before drilling or modifying any well
- Well Driller License Required
 - ► AZ well driller list: http://www.azwater.gov/dwr/Content/Drillers
- Meet minimum well construction standards

Post Well Drilling Requirements

- ▶ The Well Driller Report and Well Log (form DWR 55-55) must be filed by the driller within 30 days after completion of drilling activities.
 - ▶ If Driller Report is not filed before 30 days past the expiration date, the well is considered to never have been drilled and the well record is cancelled.

▶ Within 30 days after installation of pumping equipment in the well, the well owner must file a Pump Installation Completion Report (form DWR 55-56).

Well Driller Report And Well Log

- Form DWR 55-55
- Must be filed by driller within 30 days of completion of drilling activities
 - If Driller Report is not filed before 30 days past the expiration date, well is considered to never have been drilled and the well record is cancelled

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Exempt Wells Within an AMA

Definition: a well having a pump with a maximum capacity of not more than thirty-five gallons per minute which is used to withdraw groundwater pursuant to A.R.S. § 45-454.A.R.S. § 45-402(8).

- May not be drilled in an AMA if any part of parcel is within 100 feet of the operating water distribution system of a municipal provider with a Designation of Assured Water Supply
- Replacement wells lawful as long as no increase in total number of operable exempt wells on applicant's land
- Only applies within AMAs

Statewide Provisions

Groundwater withdrawn from outside of the AMA and INA boundaries can be restricted in terms of its transportation between groundwater basins, but is generally subject only to the requirement "for reasonable and beneficial use."

Exemptions

- McMullen Valley
- Harquahala INA
- Big Chino
- Butler Valley

Statewide Provisions

The Arizona State Supreme Court has ruled that landowners do not own the groundwater beneath their property, but rather have the right to withdraw those waters. The Court stated in Town of Chino Valley vs City of Prescott, "In the absolute sense, there can be no ownership in seeping and percolating waters until they are reduced to actual possession and control by the person claiming them because of their migratory character. Like wild animals free to roam as they please, they are the property of no one."

Shared Wells

- Private contracts
- ▶ Disputes are a civil matter
- ► ADWR will not enforce, regulate, mediate, or provide legal advice
- ▶ Shared well agreements may be appropriate to serve up to 14 service connections or up to 24 residents in an area.

Arizona Strategic Vision For Water Supply Sustainability

- Published in January 2014
- **Purpose:** To identify strategies to help address Arizona's future water needs and provide a stable economy for the future
 - Used existing information
 - Identified local options first
 - Identified priority strategies
- Conclusion: Ultimately, the State of Arizona is not facing an immediate water crisis
 - Growing statewide imbalance between existing water supplies and demand projected in the next 25 years
 - There are some local areas that require more immediate action
 - The lack of an immediate problem increases the potential for inaction

Governor's New Water Initiative

- Governor Ducey announced a new water initiative "through ADWR to help ensure the certainty and vitality of Arizona's water supply long into the future"
 - Announcement made on October 5, 2015
 - Continues the work published in the Strategic Vision
 - Initiative involves two parallel tracks...

Governor's Water Initiative First Track

First track:

- Prioritize and evaluate all of the 22 Planning Areas identified in the Strategic Vision
- ADWR will work closely with 22 Planning Areas individually to refine water supply and demand issues and identify strategies to meet future water demands.
 - Cochise Planning Area is the first target Planning Area
 - ADWR is working on prioritizing the other Planning Areas
- ADWR has been given authority to hire 3 new full time employees for this track
 - 2-Water Resource Planners
 - I Hydrologist

Governor's Water Initiative Second Track

Second track:

- Governor will appoint a team to investigate long-term augmentation strategies, explore additional water conservation opportunities, identify infrastructure needs and will report back to the Governor with policy direction or statutory changes
 - Team will be led by ADWR Director
 - Annual progress report will be due June 30th
- ADWR has been given authority to hire 2 new full time employees for this track
 - 2- Water Resource Planners

Surface Water

Definition

"waters of all sources, flowing in streams, canyons, ravines or other natural channels, or in definite underground channels, whether perennial or intermittent, floodwaters, wastewater, or surplus water, and of lakes, ponds, and springs on the surface" (A.R.S. § 45-141)

Doctrine of prior appropriation governs use

- "First in Time, First in Right"
- Beneficial Use
- Senior Water Right Holders' must be fully satisfied before water is available to Junior Rights

Pre - June 12, 1919 Process

Notice of a appropriation at the point of diversion

Public Water Code (1919)

- Application to Appropriate
- Certificate of Water Right (Proof of Appropriation)

Public Water Code

- Must Apply and Obtain Permit Prior to Appropriating Surface Water
- ► Unless:
 - Water is from the mainstream of the lower Colorado River
 - Contract with the Secretary of the Interior is required
 - ► The person or their predecessor-in-interest, lawfully appropriated the water prior to March 17, 1995 and has filed a Statement of Claim for the appropriation with the state
 - Water is stored in a stockpond constructed after June 12, 1919 and before August 27, 1977

Beneficial Uses

- ▶ Basis, Measure and Limit to the use of water (A.R.S. § 45-141(B))
- ▶ Beneficial uses are (A.R.S. § 45-151(A)):
 - domestic (which includes the watering of gardens and lawns not exceeding one-half acre),
 - municipal
 - irrigation
 - stockwatering
 - recreation
 - wildlife including fish
 - nonrecoverable water storage
 - mining

Surface Water Filings

- Applications for Permit to Appropriate Public Water of the State or Construct a Reservoir
 - ▶ 33- prefix
 - A or R prefixes prior to 1972
- Applications for Permit to Appropriate Public Water For Instream Purposes
 - ▶ 33- prefix
- Claims of Water Right for a Stockpond and Application for Certification
 - ► 38-prefix
- Statements of Claim of Right to Use Public Waters of the State of Arizona
 - 36- prefix

Appropriate Public Water of the State of Arizona or to Construct A Reservoir

- File a Permit to Appropriate Public Water
 Application & Filing Fee of \$1,000
- Licensing Time Frame of 450 days for ADWR to make a determination
- ▶ ADWR is to approve application unless:
 - Proposed use conflicts with vested rights
 - Is a menace to public safety
 - Is against the interest & welfare of the public
- Application will be posted on ADWR website for public noticing

After permit is issued:

- The permit holder is authorized to construct the diversion works and put the water to a beneficial use
- The permit holder has two years to begin construction of the diversion works and up to 5 years to put the water to beneficial use

Certificate of Water Right (Proof Of Appropriation)

- File Certificate of Water Right
 Application and Filing Fee of \$1,000
- Licensing Time Frame of 120 days for ADWR to make a determination
- ► ADWR will conduct an inspection to confirm the information in the Proof of Appropriation
- ADWR will issue the permit holder a Certificate of Water Right with a priority date that relates back to the date of the application

- All certificates are for specific uses at specific places and are endorsed with the priority date and extent and purpose(s) of the right
- The right must be beneficially used or it may be subject to abandonment and forfeiture

Applications For Permit To Appropriate Public Water of the State of Arizona For Instream Purposes

An "Instream flow application" is for the appropriation of water for purposes of recreation or wildlife, including fish, in a specific stream reach without diverting the water from the stream.

- File a Permit to Appropriate Public Water of the State of Arizona for Instream Flow Purposes Application & Filing Fee of \$1.000
- Minimum of five years of streamflow measurement data and a streamflow study must be submitted with the application
- ADWR is to approve application unless
 - Proposed use conflicts with vested rights
 - Is a menace to public safety
 - Is against the interest & welfare of the public
 - Application will be posted on ADWR website for public noticing

- Licensing Time Frame of 580 days for ADWR to make a determination
- After approval of a permit for applications submitted prior to August 2, 2012, the permit holder has four years to demonstrate that the instream flow water right is being used in a manner consistent with terms of the issued permit.

Certificate of Water Right (Proof of Appropriation)

For applications submitted prior to August 2, 2012

- File Certificate of Water Right Application and Filing Fee
- Licensing Time Frame 120 days for ADWR to make a determination
- ADWR may conduct an inspection to confirm the information in the Proof of Appropriation
- ADWR will issue the permit holder a Certificate of Water Right with a priority date that relates back to the date of the application

- File a Claim of Water Right for a Stockpond Application & Filing Fee of \$10.00

 - The stockpond was constructed after June 12, 1919 and prior to August 27, 1977
 - The stockpond is used exclusively for watering of livestock and/or wildlife
 - The stockpond has a maximum capacity of 15 acre-feet
 - The stockpond was not the subject of water rights litigation or protest prior to August 27, 1977.
- Licensing Time Frame of 220 days for ADWR to make a determination

- ADWR will conduct an investigation
- ▶ ADWR is to issue certificate if:
 - material facts stated in the claim are true and entitle the claimant to a water right for the stockpond
- Application will be posted on ADWR website for public noticing
- Once every five years, the certificate holder will be asked to sign to Statement of Continuing Use Form

General Adjudications

Judicial proceedings to determine the nature, extent, and relative priority of water rights (quantify and prioritize)

- ADWR provides technical and administrative support to the adjudication court
- Two general stream adjudications:
 - Gila River System and Source (Gila Adjudication)
 - Little Colorado River System and Source (LCR Adjudication).



Gila River Adjudication

- Initiated in 1974
- Over 53,000 Square Miles of Area
 - ► (14% State, 19% Private, 67% Federal)
- ▶ 7 Watersheds
- I6 Indian Reservations
- ▶ 38,000 Claimants
- ▶ 83,000 Statement of Claimants (SOC's)
- ▶ 104,000 Claimed Uses

Subflow

- Appropriable water under Arizona law includes surface water and certain subsurface water referred to as "subflow."
- ▶ Southwest Cotton case (1931) defined appropriable subflow as follows: The underflow, <u>subflow</u> or undercurrent, as it is variously called, of a surface stream may be defined as those waters which slowly find their way through the sand and gravel constituting the bed of the stream, or the lands under or immediately adjacent to the stream, and are themselves a part of the surface stream. It is subject to the same rules of appropriation as the surface stream itself.
- Subflow and surface water both subject to adjudication process
- ► Subflow Impact: adjudication process may include water uses from wells depending on location and other factors
- Subflow delineation in the San Pedro River watershed is current ongoing but not started in Verde Watershed

Hydrographic Survey Reports (HSR)

- ► ADWR is required to prepare and publish comprehensive HSRs for each of the ten watersheds within the two adjudications
- Upper Salt, San Pedro & Silver Creek completed, Verde initiated
- ► HSRs can be multivolume publications that involve intensive data collection and field inspection efforts by ADWR
- Include detailed information regarding land ownership
- Provide hydrologic analyses
- Summarize factual basis for each SOC
- Provide ADWR's recommendations regarding the water rights attributes for each individual water right claim or use investigated

New Use Summons

- ► ADWR's records indicate owner may have initiated new use of water including:
 - Application for a surface water right
 - Approved NOI for a new well
 - Late well registration
- ▶ Directs owner make any claims to water rights by filing the appropriate court-approved forms known as statement of claimant (SOC)
- No need to appear in court to file SOCs
- Information provided on filing fees, when and where to file, and impact of failing to file
- ▶ If you do not file an SOC, you may lose your water rights, and you may be prevented from claiming those rights later

Statement Of Claimants (SOCs)

By court order, a statement of claimant must be assigned whenever there is a change in ownership of land for which the claim for a water right was made, or there is a change in ownership of the water right that is either not appurenant to land or that has been transferred from one parcel of land to another. This form is to be used to assign statements of claimant ("39s") filed in the general adjudication of the Gila River System and Source, which includes the Salt River, San Pedro River, Upper Gila River, Verde River, Agua Fria River, Lower Gila River and Upper Santa Cruz River watersheds. After the assignment is completed, the new owner will be substituted as a party in the Gila River adjudication.

General Instructions

Each side of this form must be completed, signed by each buyer and seller, and notarized. The name, address and phone number for each buyer and seller must also be provided. If necessary, additional copies of this form may be attached.

A copy of a legal document that establishes that a change of ownership has occurred must be submitted with this form. This requirement may be satisfied by providing either a copy of a duly recorded deed, a copy of the county assessor's tax parcel notice, or other similar document.

More than one statement of claimant may be assigned on a single form if the assignors (sellers) and assignees (buyers) are identical. Otherwise, a separate form must be submitted. For example, if the ownership of the land or the water right is subdivided and conveyed to different buyers, then a separate form must be completed for each of the different buyers.

The Department will record the assignment and forward this form to the Superior Count of Maricopa County. 




